\* Membership Types:

1. A **full** membership is available to owners and part owners of registered boats, or people with a keen and active interest in the 505 class. Privileges are to hold office, to vote and to sail in class championships and any other races sponsored by the class association.

2. An **associate** membership is available to part-owners or non-boat owners who are interested in the class and such members may act as skipper or crew in any class race but may not vote or hold office. However, there shall be at least one full member (or family member) for each registered boat. This class of membership is also open to boat owners who are full members of other national class associations.

3. A **family** membership is available to two or more active 505 sailors living at the same address. Privileges are extended for two full members (ie, to hold office and to vote) and for all other members in the household to sail in class championships and any other races sponsored by the class association.

## WHAT'S A 505?

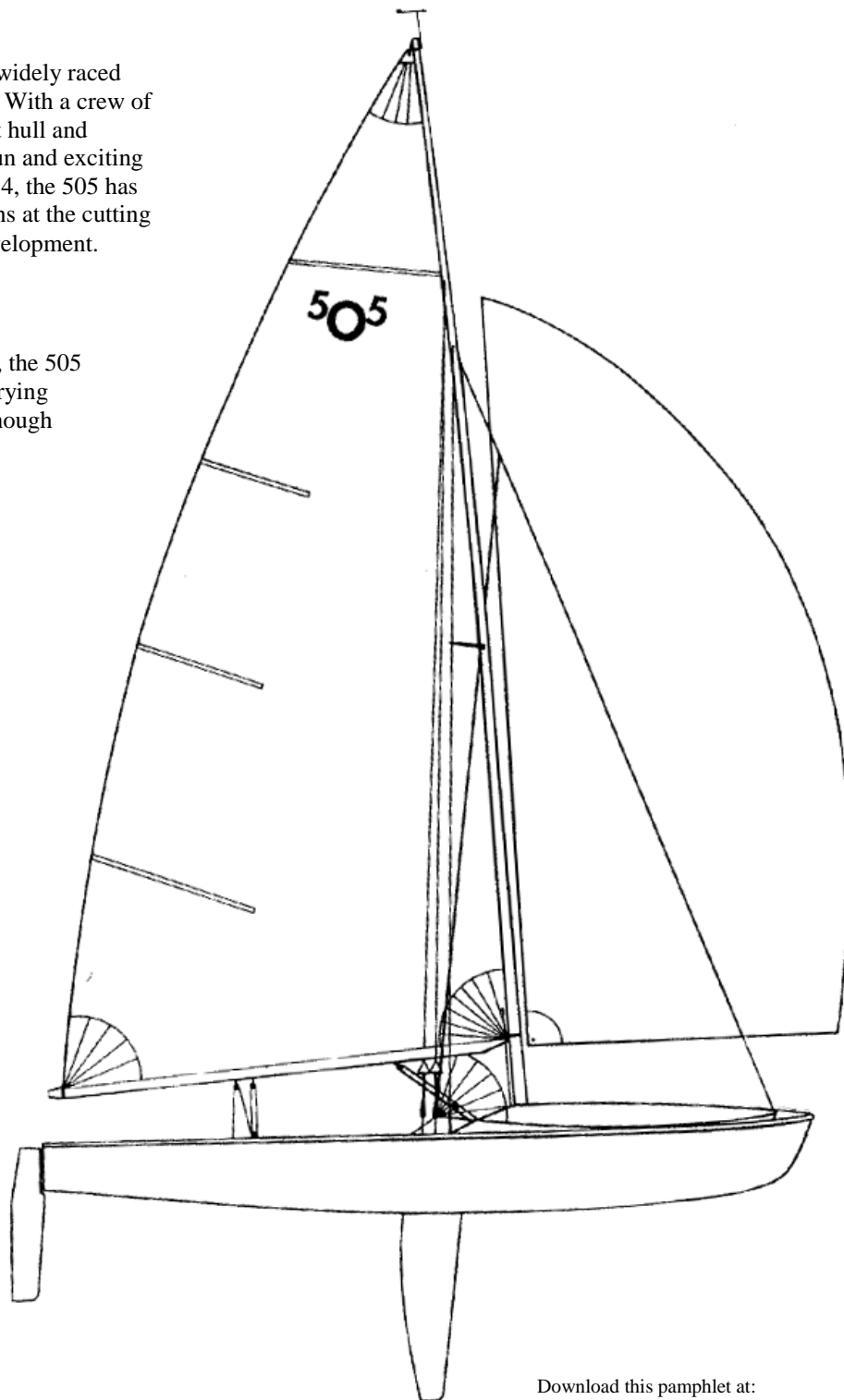
The 505 is one of the most popular and widely raced high performance dinghies in the world. With a crew of two and a single trapeze, the lightweight hull and powerful sail plan create a boat that is fun and exciting to sail in all conditions. Designed in 1954, the 505 has enjoyed unparalleled longevity and remains at the cutting edge of technology in dinghy racing development.

## WHO SAILS 505's?

Because of its beautiful sailing qualities, the 505 attracts a wide variety of sailors with varying backgrounds and experience levels. Although most join the fleet after mastering less exciting boats, some are lucky enough to learn to sail on a "five-o", as they are affectionately known. There are quite a few women 505 sailors, most of whom (but not all!) skipper, including two former North American champions. Depending on location, most crews have a combined weight of between 135 and 170 kg (~300 - 380 lbs), with 155 kg (~340 lbs) being a typical combined weight. And one thing that all newcomers agree on is that the 505 crowd is the nicest, most helpful and fun bunch of sailors around!

## WHERE ARE 505's SAILED?

The 505 is truly an international class, with large fleets in the UK, Australia, France, Germany, Denmark and Sweden, in addition to the active fleets in the US and Canada. Vancouver and Ottawa are the most active fleets in Canada, with growing fleets in Montréal, Toronto and Kingston. 505's are also active in the BC interior, Alberta, Saskatchewan and the Lac St-Jean region of Québec.

## HOW MUCH DOES IT COST? DO I NEED TO BUY A BOAT?

Entry level boats can be purchased for \$2000 - \$4000, while very good and competitive boats may sell for \$5,000 - \$8,000. But you don't necessarily need to buy your own boat. If you're keen and committed, there are always people looking for crew. There are even a couple of "fleet" boats in Canada, in which a fleet maintains a boat for use by sailors new to the class.
