Since that time it has hosted two 505 World Championships (1966 & 1983) and several 505 National Championships.

The club has also played host to 420 World Championships (1973 & 1982) and Flying Dutchman World Championships in 1995.

Every year the B&SYC is host to at least one Australian Championship

series for various International and National classes.

Regatta management at the B&SYC is a 'well-oiled machine'.



Australian law requires that goods being shipped to Australia must complete the correct paperwork to ensure hassle free entry and exit.

It is strongly recommended that an ATA-Carnet be obtained before shipping boats to Australia.

An ATA-Carnet can be obtained from your countries 'Department of Trade

and Commerce' after the payment of a security. Allow plenty of time to do this prior to shipping.

ATA-Carnets are then presented to your Customs Department at the time of export and your shipping company/agent will present these documents to Australian Customers on arrival of the container.

*At any stage customs can request inspection of the goods to ensure what is in the container matches the description on the ATA Carnet. Commercial Invoices and Carnet must agree.
